The Darkness is Not Dark to You: An Invitation to Lent 2023

We live in a world that prefers to operate out of dualities: This or that. Left or right. Right or wrong. Good or evil. Life or death. Light or dark. Black or white.

Except experience shows us that life is never that simple.

The Bible shows us that faith and God, like life, are far more complex than our simplistic interpretations or our assumptions. Nothing can ever be reduced to just one thing. God has designed each aspect of God's diverse creation to be far more beautiful than that.

This Lent, we will venture into the Bible to explore one of these particular dualities: darkness and light.

the Bible's great metaphors about light. In John 8:12, Jesus says, "I am the light of the world." And John 1:5 says, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

Reading passages like these, it may be tempting to equate light singularly with good. If we make this singular equation, it's tempting to thus

the darkness not dark Psalm 139:12a Psalm 139:12 says, "Even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you."



The Season of Lent is Coming Soon! What does this mean?

If Ash Wednesday and Lent are new to you (or if you have participated before but have unanswered questions), this might be a helpful place to start:

Why Ashes? Where do these ashes come from?

In the beginning, when God created everything, Genesis 2:7 says that God created the first people from "the dust of the ground." The Bible also promises us that God "raises up the poor from the dust; he lifts the needy from the ash heap" (1 Samuel 2:8). On this one special day in the church year, we mark ourselves with ashes to remember 1) that God created us, and 2) that though we are mortal (will die one day), God gifts to us everlasting life.

The ashes we use to mark ourselves on Ash Wednesday are not human ashes; the ashes we use come from a palm branch that has been burned and then cooled before use.

What is Lent?

Lent is so much more than giving up chocolate and counting down the days until Easter! Lent is a season in the church year when we focus on three ways to give: giving of ourselves through prayer, giving of our resources (money, time, etc), and giving of our comforts through fasting. In all three of these practices, we shift our focus away from "the usual" in order to focus on God and connect with God more. Lent is 40 days long, giving us enough time to commit to one of these faith practices and watch to see what God will do!

We will be:


- Excitedly encouraging you to bring as much nonperishable food items as you can for those in our community who are food-insecure. All food you bring goes to the Open Door Food Pantry





Affirm Lenten Mentors 2023:

For the season of Lent, will shift our focus onto two things: Lenten Worship and Lenten Mentors. Here is a brief introduction to what you can expect for Lenten Mentors this year:

- 6th and 7th grade Affirm youth will each work one-on-one with a Lenten Mentor of their choosing, having a 30-minute conversation immediately following Lenten Worship each week. Affirm youth and parents should begin considering whom you might ask to be your Lenten Mentor. You may have the same Lenten Mentor each year. A Lenten Mentor can be a family member, a godparent/sponsor, or a trusted adult friend from church; they can be a member of St. John's or a member of another church, however they will need to attend in-person with you. A short discussion guide will be provided for each Lenten Mentor + Affirm youth pair.
- 8th and 9th grade Affirm youth will spend these weeks learning about Luther's Small Catechism,

also attending Lenten Worship each week. 8th and 9th graders will use this time to become well -acquainted with the 10 commandments, Lord's Prayer, and Apostles Creed and what they mean for our life of faith today.

Affirm youth and their Lenten Mentors should plan to attend worship together each Wednesday of Lent at 6:30 pm. Families and people of all ages are invited to worship. Immediately following the end of each Wednesday worship service, Lenten Mentors and Affirm Youth will move directly into their Mentor conversations throughout the church building and will conclude at 8:00pm.

Opportunities to serve

Being a servant of Christ and others is at the heart of Christian discipleship at St. John's There are many ways to grow in faith and serve at church and in the community. You can serve in the following ways.

Sunday Mornings:

Reader in Church (Read a lesson in worship), Sunday Usher (Bulletins, Offering, Communion direction), Hospitality Team (Sunday coffee and other congregational meals), Worship Coordinator (Assist pastors with Sunday server coordination), Livestream Team (Help Livestream worship services), Sound Tech Team (Run audio equipment for worship services), Clicker Team (Youth or adults: Sign up to operate the clicker (advance the slides) during worship), **Communion Prep** Team (Help prepare and care for Communion at worship services), Communion Serving in worship (Help pastors serve Holy Communion during worship services), Cantor in Worship (Help lead hymn-singing in worship from the cantor microphone), **Chancel** Choir (Sing in worship with other choir members), Acolyte/Crucifer (Youth: Carry the cross into and out of worship, or light and extinguish the candles during worship), Junior Usher (Youth: Assist with ushering responsibilities, including bulletin distribution, offering collection, and more), Offering Counting Team (Help count offerings after worship), Sunday school teacher (Help teach a class from preschool through 4th grade on Sunday mornings),

During the week:

Loaves and Fishes (Monthly serving of meal for those in need), Funeral Meal Ministry (Help set up and serve meals for funerals), Liturgical Art Team (Help decorate sanctuary and church) Horticulture Team (Help with plants on church campus), Affirm Small Group leader (Lead small group of 6-8 Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, or Ninth Grade kids on Wednesday nights after pastor's teaching time), Computer Support Tech Team (IT knowledge is very helpful in keeping church's computers and network up to date), Office Receptionist when needed (Volunteer needed when other staff are unavailable). STAFFED NURSERY

Children, Youth and Family ministries at St John's strive to create a seamless line of ministry from birth through high school and to walk alongside families to raise compassionate, respectful, and service - orientated children – with hearts of faith-filled love.

Our nursery is part of that promised mission to walk alongside families. We believe that caring for children in the safe, nurturing environment of the nursery is essential in order for parents to tend to their own spiritual care by participating in church activities and is part of that journey. We encourage and support parents to participate in choir, teaching, mentoring, Adult Ed Classes (ACE), Bible Studies, and worship; though children are always welcome in worship, we know there are times when nursery care may be a better option for your family.

When you bring your children to the nursery, they will be safely in the care of St. John's Nursery Paid Staff who are: high school juniors and seniors who are trained in CPR & First Aid, familiar with basic child development, and have passed a background check.

Global Missions Team News

The St. John's Global committee was excited to receive this correspondence in December letting us know that the following was happening. With the dispensary being built a more reliable source of water is needed.


My name is Ken Smith and I am the vice chair of St Paul Partners, a BKB affiliate organization. <u>https://stpaulpartners.org/</u> I also am one of three instructors for an upcoming University of Minnesota class "Design for Life" heading to the Iringa region December 28th through January 15th. This is the eighth year for this class which started in 2014 and will be the first class since the pandemic started in 2020. Along with 14 upper-level students in the college of science and engineering we will be visiting three villages January 6-8 to design systems to provide clean and safe water. St John's Lutheran's partner parish, Muhanga, will be one of the villages we visit.

I just wanted to make you aware of this visit. Along with designing a system to supply safe water to Muhanga we hope (but do not promise) that St Paul partners can implement the design in the future. To date ~14 of the villages or schools visited by U of M students over the years have been provided with safe and clean water. Total cost of these systems is ~\$340,000 and they serve over 20,000 people.

• It would be wonderful if interested people from St John's Lutheran could also attend the final student presentations the evening of February 28th 2023 on the U of M campus. Engagement by partner churches means a lot to the students.

Here are some pictures of their visit:



We arrived in Muhanga village at 1 p.m. after a four-hour long African massage (bumpy car ride). We were warmly welcomed with a song and dance, including dancing with bowls on their feet. Once we got settled, we hiked to two potential sources. We got caught in a rainstorm, but luckily, we had met a new rafiki (friend), who let us wait it out at his house.

On Saturday, we hiked 10 miles in the mountainous village to see potential water sources and understand the map of the village.



On Sunday, we went to church and were impressed by the choir performances. We handed out candy to kids and adults alike and started a soccer game. Then we headed home back down the mountain. We had to stop to rescue the Idete group, but thanks to us, all of us made it safely

back to Iringa.





The Lenten Bank Project here at St. John's directly supports this work of providing clean water in Muhanga. Be sure to pick up your Lenten Bank and collect cash and change throughout lent and see how we, together with other churches in our Synod, can make a difference for the people of Muhanga.

The Ministry Finance Team Financial Performance Report

The Ministry Finance Team is responsible for monitoring, reviewing, and reporting the financial activities of the congregation. The Ministry Finance Team also recommends strategies and options to Congregational Leadership and committees to optimize the stewardship of funds contributed to the Church.

The MFT worked with Staff, the Return Team, and Council to ensure efficient use of Church resources and conservative budgeting for 2022. The Ministry teams have been very faithful in their financial stewardship which helped to smooth the path to a return of in-person worship and other activities at St. John's.

One of the primary ongoing tasks of the Ministry Finance Team is to ensure that funds received by the church are appropriately recorded and allocated to various areas of Ministry. We ensure financial transparency by having multiple people count and record offerings, have the Treasurer review accounting reports, and related financial information to ensure accountability.

You can help ensure the accuracy and transparency of St. John's financial records by signing up for direct deposit of your financial offering through the Tithe.ly app. Check the St. John's website to sign up!

A special 'thank you" goes out to Tyra Wiemann, Financial Analyst for her ongoing work for the congregation. With our new streamlined process, Tyra prepares the monthly reports for review by the Treasurer and the Ministry Finance Team. The finance reports are forwarded to the Church Council for their review and approval monthly.

The Treasurer and a representative of the Ministry Finance Team will present the St. John's 2022 financial results during the ACE education hour at 9:30 am on Sunday, January 15, 2023. This session will also be livestreamed and available through the St. John's website.

The Ministry Finance Team is committed to Transparency of operation and Stewardship of Church Funds and Resources. We encourage members of the congregation to let any of the Finance Team members know if you have questions, comments or would like additional information on the finances of St. John's Lutheran Church, Lakeville.
