Dear members and friends of St. John's,


Lent has started off in an inauspicious way. A winter storm caused Ash Wednesday's cancellation. The good news is that Ash Wednesday will be observed during our Lenten service on Wed., Mar. 1. We will gather around this deeply meaningful calling of Lent to realize the frailty of our lives, including our own mortality, to confess our sins and deepest needs, and to once again renew our relationship with God in which we fully depend on God's mercy and grace toward us. No blizzard can stop us from being able to start Lent in this faithful way. I hope to see even more of you than may have been here on Feb. 22 for our Mar. 1 Ash Wednesday service at 6:30 pm. Turn to the next page in this *Journal* for the rest of the Lenten schedule that takes place over the course of this month and for each Wednesday's schedule.

More than anything, I am looking forward once again to joining with you in our Lenten tradition of examining our lives and our faith, of renewing our commitment to God and to living for God rather than just for ourselves, and to doing intentional preparation of ourselves to experience the way humans (including us) have rejected God by our sin and the way God has responded to this so surprisingly: that Jesus would sacrifice himself on our behalf in order to take on our sin and rejection of God and put the power of that sin and rejection to death. This is what God does. God is the one who allows for our relationships to continue with God. We don't do this. God opens up possibilities for us to stay in a relationship of love and renewal with God and Christ Jesus shows us this grace over and over again. culminating at the cross of his crucifixion to vengeful humans who have rejected Him. And He rises in God's power of new life over this. God is the one who allows for our relationships to continue with the God of our salvation.


This year during Lent, Pastor Kim and I will help us reflect on how we consider the darkness in our lives, times we often think are only destructive, while God tells us they, in fact, can be very, very constructive and renewing. 

You can drop your banks off in the rain barrel in the sanctuary any Sunday during Lent you are in church. Thank you for participating in this important project again this year. All banks are due back by Easter Sunday, Apr. 9. After Easter, we will report the result of this fundraiser! for the people of Muhanga.



Creating a Culture of Generosity

March, 2023 brings us the return of quarterly pew cards that communicate current needs here at church that do not fall within our ministry budget. You may recall seeing these "Memorials and Special Gifts: Current Needs and Wish List for Financial Gifts Above and Beyond Regular Offerings" cards prior to COVID, but they now have finally made a reappearance. We hope you will take a look at them next time you are in church. So very often, special gifts in memory or in honor of someone special help fund needs at church that generally are one-time needs. For this quarter, for instance, we would glad receive financial gifts toward one of five specific initiatives: 1) an upgrade of video Livestream capabilities (this is a \$30,000 project and is our highest current need); 2) the purchase of a new piano (a \$50,000+ project); 3) landscaping and other initial amenities in our new Memorial Garden; 4) liturgical art (banners, seasonal decorations, etc. in the sanctuary and narthex); and 5) a sidewalk from the Memorial Garden to the parking lot with handicapped accessibility (an approximately \$15,000 project). Music News



One of the great strengths of the liturgical calendar is that, as it cycles through the seasons of Jesus' life and ministry, it speaks to our whole life and the full gamut of human experience. Our Lenten hymnody and special music will include penitential reflection as well as gratitude and praise.

For Palm/Passion Sunday the Sunday School children will celebrate Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem with exuberant Hosannas. The solemn observance of Christ's Passion will begin in traditional fashion with the Chancel Choir presenting several movements of the ancient funeral liturgy, which is named by the first word of the Introit text – *Requiem*. The musical

setting is by Gabriel Fauré, Organist at Church of the Madeleine and Director of the Paris Conservatoire at the turn of the 20th century.

You might wish to meditate on the text which will be projected and read before each movement. Portions of the text are familiar: *Kyrie eleison* – Lord have mercy; *Sanctus* – Holy, holy, holy; *Agnus Dei* – Lamb of God. Other texts are particular to this specific liturgy, particularly the opening lines which recur: *Requiem aeternam dona eis Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis* – Grant them eternal rest Lord, and may eternal light shine on them. Or you may choose to simply experience the music as a spiritual pilgrimage through the sorrow, regrets, and fears of death to the promise of eternal life "*In Paradisum*."
