We have entered the season of Easter in full force, right on time. After 10 months of discernment, thoughtful curiosity, and wondering what God is up to among us, we are taking a big step forward into new life, and I am humbly thrilled that you, St. John's, have called me to be your next Senior Pastor! This is a wonderful congregation, and as I have said before, I love being your pastor. It is a joy for me to have the privilege of walking beside you, supporting and challenging you to be the beloved community of faith that God calls vou to be, and I am abuzz with possibilities and hope for our future together.

Thank you for these 10 months since Pastor Andy's retirement, which have given me time, experience and encouragement to discern what is best for St. John's next chapter of life together. Finally, I have hope that God is already stirring in the heart of our next Associate Pastor! Over the years, this congregation has been blessed with a variety of wonderful pastors, and we should have every expectation that God will call another fantastic pastor to St. John's.

Let's continue onward together, into the new life God has in store for us, as beloved Easter people!



Join us as we find God EVERYWHERE! Every week, we look for God in our Everyday Lives with a video and devotions based on the week's Gospel, wherever we happen to be. We've found God in the hilltops above Lisbon, Portugal, at the American Revolution in Boston, MA, in the desert in California, on the shores of the Cook Inlet in Anchorage, AK, and every place and week in between!

Our weekly messages include a 3-5 minute video (available on St. John's YouTube channel, and through the website and app), as well as a one page devotional that summarizes the reading, asks a few questions, and encourages an action step for the week to come. The videos and devotional are both built so that they can be used alone or together, and while the Bible reading is always encouraged, no advance Bible reading or knowledge is needed to enjoy EBC. EBC emphasizes Jesus' love, God's purpose for us, and how we can relate the week's message to our lives in 2024. EBC is a work of joy and love, driven by the faithful belief that the Bible can be applied to our Everyday Lives all things big and small, all the time, everywhere!



Ministry Finance Team Report

The Ministry Finance Team presents this **Financial Performance Report for February 2024** to the Saint John's Lutheran Church Congregation and St. John's Lutheran Church Council. The MFT thanks you for your ongoing financial support and encourages you to remain faithful in your giving as the year continues and we all experience new challenges.

The first two months of 2024 have been financially challenging for St. John's. After a strong finish to 2023, it was expected that giving would take a pause in early 2024. That has occurred. Regardless of short-term challenges, we pledge to meet the needs of the congregation and the larger community outside of the church. With that as background, the following is a summary financial report for February and the year-to-date numbers.

February 2024 Summary

Financial results for February 2024 were challenging from a financial perspective. We are fortunate to have funds in reserve to cover our monthly cashflow deficit. We expect that our financial picture will improve with Easter in March and as our programs and attendance continue to grow.

We expect to have a full complement of staff in place by the end of the first quarter of 2024, which will also help in managing our budget. We encourage you to reach out with questions about Church finances and to ask about opportunities to serve and give to support the programs of St. John's.

General Fund Report - 2024

For February 2024:

- Offering revenue was \$36,818 which is 14% below budget
- General Fund revenues & transfers were \$40,974, which is 9% below budget
- General Fund expenses were \$52,470, which is 6% over budget
- General Fund net operating performance was a negative \$11,496

PPP funds (a one-time funding source) of \$1,521were used to support monthly cash flow

Full Year 2024:

- General Fund revenues & transfers were \$89,016, which is 1.4% under budget
- General Fund expenses were \$102,712, which is 2.3% over budget

- General Fund net operating performance was a negative \$11,496
- Net of receipts to expenses year-to-date is (\$13,696) including PPP allocation

Net of receipts to expenses year-to-date is (\$16,738) excluding PPP allocation

February financial results were short of budgeted amounts, for income, while expenses exceeded budget. Pending a final decision on rostered ministry staff, monthly Staffing expenses will vary from budget. Mild weather has favorably moderated operating expenses compared to budget.

Benevolence Fund Report

The Benevolence Fund is allocated a portion (8%) of total offering revenues and all dedicated contributions. Benevolence Fund expenditures are distributed periodically according to identified need. Distributions are typically made late in the calendar year as funding needs are identified and approved.

For February 2024:

- Benevolence Fund allocations and revenue received is \$3,206, 11% below budget
- Other Benevolence income contributed \$3,525, 217% over budget
- Benevolence Fund distributions were \$2,798, equal to budget

Net Benevolence income and distributions year-todate are on budget

The Benevolence fund in good financial shape to respond to St. John's and larger community needs in 2024. Benevolence distributions are being made as appropriate, with substantial distributions expected late in the calendar year.
