14. In honor of Earth Day 2024, we would like to share some information about recycling and composting and how you can get involved over the next few weeks. At St. John's we are working very hard to reduce our waste and minimize our carbon footprint on God's earth.

St. John's received a grant from Dakota County which allowed us to reinvigorate our recycling program and start our composting program. Here are some facts and resources from Dakota County regarding composting.

- It takes a lot of water, energy and fuel to get food to our plates, yet we trash ~~2~~ 40 percent of the food in the U.S.
- Food is the largest part of our trash in Minnesota. In Dakota County, household trash usually ends up in a landfill where the food rots and produces methane, a greenhouse gas more than 20 times more powerful than carbon dioxide.
- Drop off organics at multiple Dakota County locations as part of a free and easy program to reduce your trash. **Here is how to sign up:** Sign up online, call 952-891-7557 or email [organics@co.dakota.mn.us](mailto:organics@co.dakota.mn.us). You'll receive a welcome kit with a free container label, compostable bags and details on how to drop-off your organics.
- Disposable food service ware is often used at parties and celebrations. Opt for BPI-certified compostable bowls, cups, utensils and plates and drop them off with your food scraps. At St. John's, all the cups, plates and disposable cutlery are compostable. They should be placed in the GREEN compostable bin when they are done being used. At home, always look for the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) logo on each product or on the box they came in. These are the only products that have been tested to break down at a commercial compost site. Don't be fooled by products marketed as "degradable", "biodegradable," or "made from plants."
- Dakota county is conducting a survey in preparation for an update to their solid waste management plan. Part of this plan involves curbside pickup of organics. To view and take the survey, go to this website.:
