As you read this, we enter the month of May!

This month will contain a series of wonderful celebrations, both for our church community and for your individual families.

With the current vision for Sunday morning ministry, including worship, education, music, and more, the staff and the Worship Arts Ministry (WAM) Team alike feel confident that slightly reducing the amount of time between ministries will foster an increasing sense of cohesion among each important element of Sunday morning ministries.

Anecdotally, I know from some of our aging members that it can be increasingly difficult to physically get up and moving as early. Likewise, parents of children and youth (of all ages) say that even an extra 15 minutes can make a difference in being on-time for Sunday morning worship and faith formation.

So, mark your calendars, St. John's. Starting Sunday, May 26th, Sunday worship will be held at 8:30 and 10:00 am.

Everyday Bible Conversations (EBC's)





We would love your help filling up our acolyte and crucifer spots for our Sunday morning worship services.

A crucifer (cross bearer) carries the cross into worship at the beginning of worship and carries it out at the end of worship. This is an important part of our worship service at St. John's because bringing the cross in signifies a special and intentional invitation to Christ to come into our worship experience.

An acolyte lights the candles at the beginning of worship on each side of the altar and then dims them at the end of worship. This brings extra light into our sanctuary, bringing special significance to the light of Christ among us. In faith, light can also represent hope, peace, and God's promise. As an acolyte you get to remind all of us that Jesus brings that to us every day.

When volunteering for these positions, you arrive 10 minutes before worship begins (8:05am and 10:20am) and then check in with the worship coordinator at the welcome desk. That person, or myself will be there to walk the student through all that they need to know.

Ministry Finance Team Report

The Ministry Finance Team presents this **Financial Performance Report for March 2024** to the Saint John's Lutheran Church Congregation and St. John's Lutheran Church Council. The MFT thanks you for your ongoing financial support and encourages you to remain faithful in your giving as the year continues and we all experience new challenges.

While the first two months of 2024 have been financially challenging for St. John's, March provided a welcome positive financial performance. Thanks to Easter occurring at the end of the month, March financial results were positive. As pledged, St. John's continues to meet the needs of the congregation and the larger community outside of the church. With that as background, the following is a summary financial report for March and the year-to-date numbers.

March 2024 Summary

Financial results for March 2024 were positive. Our financial picture has improved with Easter in March. We see signs that our programs are increasingly well attended, and worship attendance continues to grow.

We have made a successful transition to Kim Kyllo as our Senior Pastor. Her Christ-centered approach, strong theological knowledge and interpersonal skills are an excellent match to help St. John's live its mission in the community. We have filled the Director of Music position by engaging Roxanne on a more permanent basis. We are in the process of calling an Associate Pastor, after which we will have a full staff, on schedule. These staffing hires assist in stabilizing our 2024 Budget.

We encourage you to reach out with questions about Church finances and to ask about opportunities to serve and give to support the programs of St. John's.

General Fund Report - 2024

For March 2024:

- Offering revenue was \$56,218 which is 1% above budget
- General Fund revenues & transfers were \$60,099, which is 3.5% above budget
- General Fund expenses were \$49,603, which is 4.2% below budget
- General Fund net operating performance was a

positive \$10,496

 PPP funds (a one-time funding source) of \$1,521were used to support monthly cash flow

Full Year 2024:

- General Fund revenues & transfers were \$149,114, which is 100% of budget
- General Fund expenses were \$152,314, which is 100% of budget
- General Fund net operating performance was a negative \$3,200
- Net of receipts to expenses year-to-date is (\$3,200) including PPP allocation
- Net of receipts to expenses year-to-date is (\$7,762) excluding PPP allocation

Pending a final decision on rostered ministry staff, monthly Staffing expenses will vary from budget. Mild weather has favorably moderated operating expenses compared to budget.

Benevolence Fund Report

The Benevolence Fund is allocated a portion (8%) of total offering revenues and all dedicated contributions. Benevolence Fund expenditures are distributed periodically according to identified need. Distributions are typically made late in the calendar year as funding needs are identified and approved.

For March 2024:

- Benevolence Fund allocations and revenue received is \$4,888, 4% above budget
- Other Benevolence income contributed \$2,245,
 6% over budget
- Benevolence Fund distributions were \$4,000, 84% of budget
- Net Benevolence income and distributions yearto-date are on budget

The Benevolence fund in good financial shape to respond to St. John's and larger community needs in 2024. Benevolence distributions are being made as appropriate, with substantial distributions expected late in the calendar year.

Building Fund Report

For March 2024:

- Building Fund revenues were \$11,529
- Building Fund expenses were \$10,094
- Building Fund Net is: \$ 1,435

Full Year 2024:

- Building Fund Revenue is \$27,793
- Building Fund expense is \$30,282
- Building Fund net is: \$ (2,489)

March was a positive month for the Building Fund cash flow. While the surplus in March was not enough to fully offset the Jan/Feb shortfalls, it did reduce the cumulative shortfall for the year. In addition, the surplus funds contributed to the building fund in 2023 allow us the flexibility to absorb near term mortgage fund shortfalls. Finally, we have over 8 months of mortgage payment reserves to secure the mortgage payment, putting us in good financial shape for the near-term.



St. John's Concert Piano Fund An Opportunity Awaits You

St. John's has a long tradition of providing great music to celebrate God. To keep that tradition in place requires musical instruments that enhance and elevate music, worship, and the musicians. For the past few years, our concert piano has been showing its age and has reached the point where it must be retired. To keep the music program growing, it is vital to replace the current piano with a new concert piano.

The music staff at St. John's has conducted extensive research and found an ideal candidate for St. John's. They presented their findings to Council, which has approved the purchase of a new piano, if the funds can be raised for the purchase. This is your opportunity to help with this task.

The cost of the new piano is \$26,000. We can trade in our current piano to reduce the cost of a new one a bit. In addition, generous donors to the Piano Fund, along with gifts from WELCA, Estate gifts and other donations have generated over \$9,100 in funding already on hand.

We have received challenge matching pledges of \$6,000, meaning if everyone contributes any amount, up to \$6,000 of those contributions will be matched dollar for dollar. That would result in an additional \$12,000 toward the piano purchase.

If you've been keeping track, we have over \$15,000 in cash and matching pledges already committed to the Piano purchase. We are asking you to contribute what you can to help raise the remaining \$11,000.

This is a "stretch request," over and above your regular giving. We ask you to prayerfully consider a gift to the St. John's Piano Fund in any amount. You can contribute by cash, check or electronically through our Tithe.ly app on your phone or computer.
