teaching human precepts as doctrines.'



## 17. Worship helpers needed

We are so thankful to have many volunteers to serve in worship and in other areas at St. John's. Some of the more pressing needs are for readers, worship coordinators, clickers and running the sound and livestream during worship.

Readers:

A **reader** is someone who reads the lesson from the lectern during worship. You can sign up for one of the upcoming openings. We also have paper sign up sheets on the welcome station for these and many more opportunities to serve.

A worship coordinator works from the welcome desk before worship to be sure all of the volunteers are in place and all of the roles are covered on a Sunday. You might need to step up in case of an opening or, you might need to ask someone to fill a spot.

Worship Coordinators

A **clicker** is someone who uses the remote to advance slides in worship so people can easily follow along with the service. You would need to check in at the sound booth and can sit anywhere in the Sanctuary to advance slides.



Clickers:

**Livestream members** get the livestream going and keep it functioning in worship. If we get enough helpers, the schedule could rotate between members.



**Sound team members** run the sound during worship. They work on a rotating schedule so your commitment would be once every 4 to 5 weeks at one of the Sunday services. Stop by the AV booth to ask more details.
