

## **All Saints Sunday Litany**

P: We gather with all the saints of every time and place in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

- P: In our baptisms, you cleansed us from the power of sin, death, and the devil, Gracious and Merciful God, making us saints in your holy kingdom.
- C: Reconciled to you by Christ's grace, we come humbly as penitent sinners, seeking your cleansing grace once again.
- P: We pause to confess our sins, held securely in the gracious, steadfast love of God...


(confess before God silently)

- P: We hear the Apostle Paul's words: When we were baptized into Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him, by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.
- C: Thanks be to Christ for grace that saves us and all the saints who have gone before us and come after us. Alleluia!
- P: We celebrate today the lives and faith of the saints who have passed down faith to us and now live in heavenly light with God. We celebrate the gospel that assures us of Christ's very presence and all-sufficient grace with us when we face death or move through grief. We celebrate faith that trusts with certainty that God carries the next generation of sinners who are also saints in their baptisms through the journeys of their lives, deaths, and resurrections, as well.
- C: Thanks be to Christ, who lived, died, was raised, and ascended to new life over the power of finality and death for all the saints, us included. Alleluia! Amen!
- P: Now, we light a candle and toll a bell for all here at St. John's who died in the faith since last All Saints Sunday...

P: Next, please turn to the baptismal font as we light a candle and toll a bell for all here at St. John's who were baptized into life in God's kingdom since last All Saints Sunday...


P: For Christ's saving grace for all the saints, we exclaim,
