P: Today, as we confess our sins, we recognize how easily we overlook the gifts God gives. And we accept the sad truth that our limitations often create the conditions for sin.


Silence for meditation.

C: for you have made a place where we can safely rest.


P: Joy ebbs and flows each day, holy God.

C: Jesus, you shape the world around us, even when you remain just out of sight. As we listen today, help us prepare our lives for you with loving anticipation. Amen.


