Jesus speaks these words to his disciples after his resurrection from death to life. These are Jesus' final words of encouragement and instruction for his disciples, and they are his final words in the gospel of Matthew. These particular words of Jesus are known as "The Great

#### Save the Date for Ash Wednesday: March 5, 2025



Do you know why the date of Ash Wednesday changes every year?

Ash Wednesday is always 46 days before Easter. Easter is determined as the Sunday following the first full moon that

happens on or after the March equinox (which is always 21 March).

Lent is 40 days long, not including Sundays. According to the calendar, that means the season is 46 days long overall. This year, that means Ash Wednesday falls on March 5. This is a sacred and holy day of prayer that is observed widely across the Christian church in many denominations. At St. John's, we'll gather for worship at 6:30 pm that evening for worship that includes repentance, prayer, and the marking of ashes. We'll hear the promise of God's love infused into the reality of human mortality in the words from Genesis 3:19, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Join us for this deeply moving service, as we gather around the promises of God. Stay tuned to the March newsletter (and all St. John's communications) for more information about our Lenten theme, worship, practices, meals, and more.



### **Ministry Finance Team Report**

The Ministry Finance Team presents this **Financial Performance Report ("FPR") for December 2024** and the **full year 2024** to the Saint John's Lutheran Church Congregation and Council.

The Ministry Finance Team is pleased to report that financially St. John's experienced both a strong December and strong full year 2024. December continued a string of positive monthly financial results, where again the financial performance of the General Fund was positive, helped by lower both as projected budgeted revenues and lower than budgeted expenses. Offering revenues were right at budget for the month. Expenses for the month were lower than the budget. That resulted in a positive financial performance for December.

We are pleased to see more people signing up for automated giving. Signing up for this service helps us manage cashflow and be more efficient, reducing operating costs. There are many ways you can support St. John's financially. You can:

#### **General Fund Report**

#### For December 2024:

• Offering revenue was \$65,549 which is right on budget for the month

• General Fund revenues & transfers were \$68,450, which is right on budget for the month

• General Fund expenses were \$83,408, which is 59% higher than budget for the month

o Overages were from timing of expenses paid, one-time transfers and expenses

o General Fund net operating performance was a negative \$14,598 for December

Excluding PPP funds (a one-time funding source), net operating performance was a negative \$16,479 for November

#### Full Year 2024:

• General Fund revenue is \$613253 which is 102% of the budget for the year

- General Fund expenses are \$575,869, which is 4.5% below budget for the year
- General Fund actual net performance compared to Budget is a positive \$32,191 for 2024
- Net of receipts to expenses for 2024 is \$37,384 including PPP allocation

Net of receipts to expenses for 2024 is \$19,134 excluding PPP allocation

#### Comments & Observations:

December financial results were strong, continuing a four-month trend, with income at budget, and operating expenses coming in below budgeted amounts. Net cash flow for the month was positive and remained positive after excluding the transfer of PPP funds.

The positive net operating result allowed us to transfer \$15,000 to the capital improvements account, which will help us manage future equipment breakdowns and provide funds to replace worn out equipment.

The Ministry Finance Team will continue to watch how actual financial results compare to budgeted amounts for the next few months. We will keep the Council and Congregation informed of future developments. Based on attendance and contribution trends, and expressions of interest in membership, we are hopeful that January 2025 and the following months will show continuing and improving financial results.

#### **Benevolence Fund Report**

The Benevolence Fund is allocated a portion (8%) of total offering revenues and all benevolence contributions from dedicated contributions. Benevolence Fund expenditures are distributed periodically according to need and the amounts available from the Benevolence Fund.

Comments and Observations

December 2024 was a very positive month for the building fund. The fund received several "catch-up" contributions that moved us from a shortfall to a surplus for the full year 2024.

We have approximately 8 months of mortgage payment reserves built up to secure the mortgage payment, meaning St. John's Building fund is in strong financial shape for the near-term future.


