

What is Holy Week?

Faith guarantees a life of learning. One of the many reasons I love serving St. John's is the variety of experiences and faith backgrounds represented among our community! Among us, we collectively have been (or still are): Roman Catholic, Missouri Synod or Wisconsin Synod Lutheran, United Methodist, Covenant, Baptist, Non-Denominational, no faith background, and more.

I find this diversity of faith and religious experience fascinating and helpful, because it means that we don't all operate out of the same set of assumptions or expectations about what it means to be a community called "church" together. Because of this variety of prior experiences, we, as a community, ask a lot of really thoughtful questions about meaning and values, which help us to know who we are together as St. John's in this time and place.

Which brings me to Holy Week.

Perhaps you came to St. John's from a different Christian denomination (that may or may not have

observed Holy Week) or perhaps you are a life-long Lutheran and always wondered: Holy Week is a time of prayer and solemnity as we remember Jesus' final days, marking the most significant week in the church year. This includes of special note: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday, culminating in the celebration of Easter!

Each of these days mark a distinct moment in Jesus' life, to which we pay special attention: both because of what it meant for Jesus and for what it means for us and how we live in the world today.

Briefly:

Palm Sunday is the day we remember Jesus entering the city of Jerusalem to the cheers of mingled hopes and fears of the crowd, where he would ultimately take on the cross and die.

Maundy Thursday is the day we remember Jesus sharing his Last Supper with his closest disciples and friends, at which meal he also washed their feet, instituting the call for the disciples (including us) to serve others as Jesus served.

Good Friday is the day we watch and bear witness to the horrors of Jesus' arrest, betrayal and crucifixion.

Easter is the day we rejoice that Jesus, who had died, rose from the grave, giving resurrection life to the world!

Of course, each of these days is absolutely essential in our life of faith, and so I implore you to come to all of these worship services, as much as you're

able, to get the fullness of this experience. These worship services are unique from other things we do at St. John's throughout the year, and they are extremely impactful. Each is designed to lead us deeper into the story of Jesus, so that we may wrestle with the work of Jesus' salvation anew this year.

Join us, I pray, as we journey together in faith this Holy Week.



Everyday Bible Conversations (EBC's)

Join us as we find God EVERYWHERE! Every week, we look for God in our Everyday Lives with a video and devotions based on the week's Gospel, wherever we happen to be. We've found God in the hilltops above Lisbon, Portugal, at the American Revolution in Boston, MA, in the desert in California, on the shores of the Cook Inlet in Anchorage, AK, and every place and week in between!

Our weekly messages include a 3-5 minute video (available on St. John's YouTube channel, and through the website and app), as well as a one page devotional that summarizes the reading, asks a few questions, and encourages an action step for the week to come. The videos and devotional are both built so that they can be used alone or together, and while the Bible reading is always encouraged, no advance Bible reading or knowledge is needed to enjoy EBC. EBC emphasizes Jesus' love, God's purpose for us, and how we can relate the week's message to our lives in 2024. EBC is a work of joy

and love, driven by the faithful belief that the Bible can be applied to our Everyday Lives all things big and small, all the time, everywhere!



Minneapolis Mission Trip March 15 and 16!


We had a wonderful and meaningful experience. Our team of 20 youth did a great job serving our service partners as well as being attentive and hardworking!

This group served in these impactful ways:


- Served at Feed My Starving Children in Eagan, packed 96 boxes, made 20, 736 meals and fed 57 kids for a year!

Youth Opportunities to serve

We would love your help filling up our acolyte and crucifer spots for our Sunday morning worships.

A crucifer (cross bearer) carries the cross into worship at the beginning of worship and carries it out at the end of worship. This is an important part of our worship service at St. John's because bringing the cross in signifies a special and intentional invitation to Christ to come into our worship experience.

An acolyte lights the candles at the beginning of worship on each side of the alter and then dims them at the end of worship. This brings extra light into our sanctuary, bringing special significance to the light of Christ among us. In faith, light can also represent hope, peace, and God's promise. As an acolyte you get to remind all of us that Jesus brings that to us every day.

When volunteering for these positions, you arrive 10 minutes before worship begins (8:05am and 10:20am) and then check in with the worship coordinator at the welcome desk. That person, or Amanda will be there to walk the student through all that they need to know.



Ministry Finance Team Report

The Ministry Finance Team presents this Financial Performance Report ("FPR") for February 2025 to the Saint John's Lutheran Church Congregation and Council.

General Fund Report

- For February 2025:
- Offering revenue of \$42,670, 93% of the month's budget
- General Fund revenue of \$44,582, 94% of the month's budget
- General Fund expenses of \$56,62, 101% of the month's budget
- General Fund net operating performance was a (loss) for the month of \$12,100

Year to Date 2025:

- General Fund revenue \$85,957, 93% of the annual budget
- General Fund expenses \$106,015, 100% of the annual budget
- General Fund actual net performance vs. Budget is (negative) \$5,184 for 2025
- Net of receipts to expenses for all of 2025 is (negative) \$16,634

Comments & Observations:

2 (two) months for financial results are in line with 2024 results and significantly better than 2021 or 2022. With the Easter season beginning in March, March may receive a slight boost financially. Easter falls in late April, so hopefully better weather will boost April results.

Benevolence Fund Report

The Benevolence Fund is allocated 8% of total offering revenues and 100% of dedicated benevolence contributions. Benevolence Fund expenditures are made according to need and the amounts available from the Benevolence Fund.

For February 2025:

- Benevolence Fund allocations were \$3,710,
 93% of budget
- Benevolence Fund contributions were \$305.

242% of budget

 Benevolence Fund distributions were \$4,874, 155% of budget

Year to Date 2025:

- Benevolence Inflows YTD are \$ 9,869
- Benevolence Distributions YTD are \$4,874
- Funds Awaiting Distribution: \$4,995
