Wednesday Lenten Series: "Inside Out Faith"

March 12 - April 9

Join us for Wednesday Lenten Worship at 6:30 pm, as we explore the vibrant landscape of the spiritual and emotional life in "Inside Out Faith." God intentionally designs and creates us in the image of God: with a body, mind, and soul, and equips us with core emotions to help us navigate this life: joy, sadness, fear, anger, and disgust. How are these five core emotions tools that provide information about the world around us and the ways we move through it? Join us as we explore one of these five emotions and how they function in our spiritual lives each week.

April 9—Inside Out Faith—Disgust

To diversify our spiritual engagement of this theme, we invite you into two optional practices alongside Wednesday Lenten Worship:

- 1. Adding to our cross mosaic after our Scripture and Message during Wednesday Lenten Worship, you will have the opportunity to engage with the core emotion for that evening by coming forward to add to the cross mosaic, using the corresponding color for that core emotion in fabric and tying it to the cross. By the end of Lent, we will together create a cross covered by a visual representation of our spiritual and emotional lives!
- 2. **Lenten Journaling** During worship each Wednesday, we'll provide a faithful framework around the function of each emotion, using Scripture. Guided journals with prompts for each of the five Lenten Wednesdays will be available for everyone, to take home for ongoing reflection on each night's core emotion. These are yours to keep and use as it is meaningful and spiritually enriching for you! You will not be asked to share your journals or turn them back into us. We pray this will deepen your spiritual life this Lenten season.

Vacation Bible School Pen Pals

This year for vacation bible school, I am hoping to have a letter/picture exchange between our campers and seniors or other adults in our St. John's community and our assisted living friends in the Lakeville community.

The idea for this project would be, you would write a letter (some tips and topics are included below) that will be given to a VBS camper. They will then read and respond to your letter, either with a letter of their own or a special picture, the week of June 16th. You should receive your letter/special picture, or several of them, the week of June 23rd.

Some tips for writing your letter to our campers:

- Since you won't know who you are writing to, you can address the letter "Dear VBS camper" or "Dear Child of God"
- Write a little bit about yourself: your name, where you live (in general, like "Lakeville" or "Highview Hills", etc.) and some things you like to do (play games, garden, read, watch sports, etc.)
- Tell the campers about a favorite bible story or a favorite Bible verse and why it's your favorite or a story from when you were in Sunday School (or VBS) or how much God means to
 you.
- To close, wish them well on their week at VBS, hope they have a nice summer or tell them
 how much you are looking forward to receiving their letters.


