I recently heard a stand up comic bemoaning his peers talking about all the upgrades they'd been doing to their homes and yards. After a long list of extravagant upgrades his friends had been making, he quipped: "The only thing I can afford to upgrade is my personality!" I laughed - but then I thought more about this line. The comedian was right. One of the amazing things about being a human being is that there is an inner world in each of us that we can't buy our way into upgrading. To grow, to change, to adapt, learn, refine, develop, and enhance something inside of us. There may be costs associated with tools to help us do those things, but in this age of information most of us have access to a trove of ideas and concepts that we could freely use to develop who we are in our inside world, which in turn changes how we engage with the world *outside* of us that we are connected so deeply to. And I'm not simply talking about upgrading our "personality." Metanoia is a Greek word that means to change our outlook or understanding. To transform, to reorient, or to change our trajectory in life. I'd also add the word "repent" but it may also bring to mind street preachers with signs and bullhorns telling people who is and isn't going to their idea of hell. There can be a lot of baggage with that particular translation of the word. Nevertheless. metanoia is used 24 times in the New Testament alone, and usually in the gospels. It would seem that this type of "upgrade", to use the comedian's language, is an important part of our life of faith.

Romans 12:2 (NRSVUE) says, "Do not be conformed to this age, but be *transformed* by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. "In this verse I hear not only an invitation to metanoia, but also a way to follow God in a world that often seems unsure of where it is going. Metanoia isn't something we merely *do*; it's something that happens *to* us. As we follow the "will of God," we can expect these moments of transformation as a *natural* byproduct of a *supernatural* gift of faith we've each been given free and clear by God.

How might God be calling us from a life of *conforming* to the old dead-end tricks the world may try to offer us and instead be *transforming* to become the Body of Christ as the church both



individually and collectively? Our hope is that this newsletter will provide you with ample opportunities - many of them free - to dare to experience

metanoia in our spiritual lives. After all, we are the church with a beautiful sculpture in front of our building to remind us of this process each time we walk by...

- a late-August newsletter for the start of the program year,
- a mid-November newsletter to preview Advent, Christmas and the start of the new year,
- a mid-February newsletter to prepare you for Lent, and
- a May newsletter to highlight upcoming summer ministries.

As always, we will strive to do our best to communicate with the whole congregation about our ministries; St. John's will continue in our regular frequency with weekly bulletin announcements, weekly E-News on Wednesdays, weekly Sunday emails with links for online worship, as well as specific CYF emails sent to program groups.

Every week, we look for God in our Everyday Lives with a video and devotions based on the week's Gospel, wherever we happen to be. We've found God in the hilltops above Lisbon, Portugal, at the American Revolution in Boston, MA, in the desert in California, on the shores of the Cook Inlet in Anchorage, AK, and every place and week in between!

Our weekly messages include a 3-5 minute video (available on St. John's YouTube channel, and through the website and app), as well as a one page devotional that summarizes the reading, asks a few questions, and encourages an action step for the week to come. The videos and devotional are both built so that they can be used alone or together, and while the Bible reading is always encouraged, no advance Bible reading or knowledge is needed to enjoy EBC. EBC emphasizes Jesus' love, God's purpose for us, and how we can relate the week's message to our lives in 2024. EBC is a work of joy and love, driven by the faithful belief that the Bible can be applied to our Everyday Lives all things big and small, all the time, everywhere!

this one-night "Surviving the Holidays" grief support event. Come, experience a momentary reprieve and be with other people who get it. All are welcome.





The program goals for Ablaze are to prep students for confirmation by reviewing key points of the Bible. We start around the campfire for the first five weeks reviewing the Old Testament, then we move indoors with a large group/small group model. In spring, we focus on preparing students to receive their Rite

of First Communion.

In Affirm, we explore each student's identity, belonging and purpose in Christ. We believe that each person is a child of God, with faith given as a gift from God. In Affirm, we build relationships in small groups, where each person can show up and be their true self, ask their real questions, and grow in faith together. Affirm operates on a four-year cycle, specifically oriented to deepening the life of faith, so that each youth can 1) develop a confidence in reading their Bible thoughtfully and well, 2) approach the world around them with spiritual curiosity, and 3) claim faith for themselves.

Content covers the message of scripture, Lutheran theology, Christian discipleship, and serving opportunities.

Grades 6-8 have one year focusing on each: "Who is Jesus," "Practicing Faith," and "I am a Lutheran."

Grade 9 becomes a capstone year, culminating in Affirmation Sunday, when 9th graders affirm their baptismal promises surrounded by family, friends, and our faith community.

Each Affirm year includes small group lessons, service projects, fellowship bonfires, Lenten mentors, and Family Milestones.

# **CYF Summer Highlights**

This summer at St. John's was truly incredible, filled with fun, spiritual growth, and wonderful opportunities for our youth to develop as leaders! We are so grateful for the many ways St. John's supported our youth in serving and loving our neighbors, both near and far.

Summer started with our VBS program where 126 children and more than 50 volunteers spent the week in a True North Adventure. The new preschool program was an overwhelming success!

Our Summer Stretch program involved 37 upper elementary and middle school students who dedicated their time to serving at Arc Value Village, the Pan-O-Prog ice cream social, Highview Hills, and Feed My Starving Children. Beyond service, they also enjoyed exciting adventures at Windy Willow, Ninja Gyms, Urban Air, and a special trip to downtown Northfield for ice cream.

This year's Mission Trip to Milwaukee was facilitated by Serve Boldly, a ministry of Green Lake Lutheran Ministries. Our group of 20, including 14 youth and 6 chaperones, focused on daily food distribution, providing hot meals and groceries to those in need. We learned so much about the creative and resourceful ways the Milwaukee community addresses the needs of its residents.

Additionally, 50 Luther Crest Bible camp adventurers attended camp over three separate weeks, participating in eight different programs. Our younger elementary campers experienced an overnight stay with a parent, while many middle school and elementary campers who stayed for a half or full week learned exciting new ways to be brave and courageous in their faith. Our high school students even served as counselors in training, gaining valuable leadership skills.

# **Ministry Finance Team Report**

The Ministry Finance Team presents this Financial Performance Report ("FPR") for May 2025 to the Saint John's Lutheran Church Congregation and Council.

## **General Fund Report**

#### For May 2025:

- Offering revenue of \$40,570, 82.3% of the month's budget
- General Fund revenue of \$41,858, 82.8% of the month's budget
- General Fund expenses of \$53.891, 100.7% of the month's budget
- General Fund net operating performance was a deficit for the month of \$12,033

#### Year to Date 2025:

- General Fund revenue \$243,864, 92% of the annual budget
- General Fund expenses \$256,285, 97% of the annual budget
- General Fund actual net performance vs. Budget is (negative) \$9.078 for 2025
- Net of receipts to expenses for all of 2025 is (negative) \$12,601

#### Comments & Observations:

The overall financial picture for 2025 is following trend. The year is going slightly less well than projected, with income running somewhat below budget, and expenses running slightly below budget. The overall cash flow is (\$12,601) for the first five months of 2025.

#### **Benevolence Fund Report**

The Benevolence Fund is allocated 8% of total offering revenues and 100% of dedicated benevolence contributions. Benevolence Fund expenditures are made according to need and the amounts available from the Benevolence Fund.

#### For May 2025:

- Benevolence Fund offerings were \$3,433, 82.2% of budget
- Benevolence Fund total income was \$4,948, 112.4% of budget
- Benevolence Fund distributions were \$5,200, 80.8% of budget

#### Year to Date 2025:

- May Mortgage cash flow turned negative for the month. Mortgage contributions are less consistent than other contributions and we expect improved cash flow later in the year
- Mortgage cash reserve maintained at approximately 8 months of mortgage monthly payments

# **Memorial Garden Update**

Early in 2016, members of the Land Use Team began having conversations about how to improve and use the property surrounding St. John's. One of the items that came up was to add Columbarium and Memorial Garden on the property. Lots of discussion and planning resulted in the installation of a Columbarium/ Ossuarium unit on one of two bases in the fall of 2022. Shortly after the installation, phase 1 of the sidewalk, from the outer Sanctuary doors to the paver base of the Columbarium was completed. A tree was donated and planted early on to kick off the soft scape plan. During the snowy winter, many able volunteers kept the access to the Memorial Garden open.

Phase 2 of the project saw the sidewalk from the parking lot completed and the garden part of the project created. Since that time, an engraved rock commemorating the gift from the Klotz family has been installed, four memorial benches were added, the garden plantings and trees have been installed and new this summer, flowering potted plants helped expand the garden area making it a true mediative space for the frequent visitors who enjoy spending time in the memorial garden. We continue to welcome any and all "above and beyond" gifts toward the Memorial Garden. The hope is that we can expand the garden area even more next spring. We thank the dedicated memorial garden team who keeps it weeded, watered and tended for everyone to enjoy.
