

We enter into the cold and often snowy season of winter, proclaiming a profound message of hope for all people, wrapped up in a small and seemingly insignificant package: a baby (of all things).

Yes, we know *who* this baby is and *who* he will become for the sake of the world, but for now, let's stick with the initial form in which God send the Messiah into the world. A fragile, helpless, ordinary human baby, who at least for the first years, could do nothing of particular significance... unless you consider eating, sleeping, pooping and crying to be especially significant.

My message for you – and for all of us together – is to notice God's presence and work not only in obvious, significant works, but also in what appears insignificant, in what might be easily overlooked or missed.

Do we long for God to do great works that bend the arc of history towards justice and peace, towards God's kingdom come in the world (as it is in heaven)? Of course! And in faith, we trust that God *is most certainly* working in those ways, regardless of whether we are able to see it or not.

And, the Christmas story reminds us that God's work is not always nor only *glaringly obvious to us*. Not only was the Word-made-flesh born as a human baby in "the little town" of Bethlehem, but our Biblical stories of his birth describe that merely a handful of people were even remotely aware that it had happened. I wonder: how long did it take before anyone besides the shepherds, and eventually murderous King Herod and the magi, even heard that *this particular baby* had been born? It took *decades* before the Christ-child consistently engaged in ministries of proclaiming healing and hope, after all!

My point is this: sometimes God chooses intentionally to show up in ways that seem ordinary, simple, or relatively regular *yet* does great and amazing work!

It is tempting in our humanity to long for God's work to be painfully obvious, grandiose, and make a sweeping impact on the world rather instantaneously. But let us not get so caught up in that longing that we miss out on the transformative work God does through seemingly-ordinary, easy-to-overlook events, too. Are you and I so preoccupied by our expectations about how God will show up in the world to make things right that we aren't paying attention to the less obvious, often subtle ways that God is making a difference, today, all around us?

This winter, in the seasons of Christmas and Epiphany (basically, the time until Lent begins), let us practice paying attention to what seems simple, to what seems insignificant, to what seems ordinary, with eyes expecting God to not only show up in them, but anticipating God's goodness and mercy, God's peace and justice.

And, as people of faith, let us also be paying attention for opportunities to share the light of Christ in our lives: in our homes, in our neighborhood, in our church, and in the world, without downplaying the positive impact of even a simple act of grace or support. Does a neighbor need your listening ear? May the light of Christ shine. Does your coworker need your grace in understanding? May the light of Christ shine. Does your child need your undivided attention after a hard day? May the light of Christ shine. Does your hungry neighbor need a meal (or more)? May the light of Christ shine.

May the light of Christ shine in our hearts, in our church, and in this weary world. May it shine for us, for all who are hurting and suffering, and for all people.

Dear people of St. John's

As you may know, the cost of postage has increased in 2025 and one of the primary expenses for the church's postage budget is our church newsletter. St. John's continually asks how we can best steward the church's resources, including the funds generously entrusted to us for mission and ministry. Seeking to spend responsibly given this (and other) rising costs, we have found a creative approach: adjusting the frequency of our church newsletters. So, in August, instead of distributing a monthly newsletter, St. John's changed to *quarterly* newsletters, following the change of seasons in the ministry of the church:

- a late-August newsletter for the start of the program year,
- a November newsletter to preview Advent, Christmas and the start of the new year,
- a February newsletter to prepare you for Lent, and
- a May newsletter to highlight upcoming summer ministries.

As always, we will strive to do our best to communicate with the whole congregation about our ministries; St. John's will continue in our regular frequency with weekly bulletin announcements, weekly E-News on Wednesdays, weekly Sunday emails with links for online worship, as well as specific CYF emails sent to program groups. If you have information that needs to be shared with the congregation, contact Candy in the church office and she will get the information out.

# Everyday Bible Conversations (EBC's) Join us as we find God EVERYWHERE!

Every week, we look for God in our Everyday Lives with a video and devotions based on the week's Gospel, wherever we happen to be. We've found God in the hilltops above Lisbon, Portugal, at the American Revolution in Boston, MA, in the desert in California, on the shores of the Cook Inlet in Anchorage, AK, and every place and week in between!

Our weekly messages include a 3-5 minute video (available on St. John's YouTube channel, and through the website and app), as well as a one page devotional that summarizes the reading, asks a few questions, and encourages an action step for the week to come. The videos and devotional are both built so that they can be used alone or together, and while the Bible reading is always encouraged, no advance Bible reading or knowledge is needed to enjoy EBC.

EBC emphasizes Jesus' love, God's purpose for us, and how we can relate the week's message to our lives in 2026. EBC is a work of joy and love, driven by the faithful belief that the Bible can be applied to our Everyday Lives all things big and small, all the time, everywhere!






### Parenting Littles: It's Just a Phase

#### **Ablaze**

Ablaze: Pre-confirmation program 5th grade students Wednesday nights 7:00pm-8:00pm



Ablaze was created to form a transitional bridge from Sunday School to our confirmation program, Affirm.

The program goals for Ablaze are to prep students for confirmation by reviewing key points of the Bible. We start around the campfire for the first five weeks reviewing the Old Testament, then we move indoors with a large group/small group model. In spring, we focus on preparing students to receive their Rite of First Communion.

#### **Affirm**

Affirm: Confirmation Ministry for 6-9th Graders Wednesday nights 7:00-8:00pm



In Affirm, we explore each student's identity, belonging and purpose in

Christ. We believe that each person is a child of God, with faith given as a gift from God. In Affirm, we build relationships in small groups, where each person can show up and be their true self, ask their real questions, and grow in faith together. Affirm operates on a four-year cycle, specifically oriented to deepening the life of faith, so that each youth can 1) develop a confidence in reading their Bible thoughtfully and well, 2) approach the world around them with spiritual curiosity, and 3) claim faith for themselves.

Content covers the message of scripture, Lutheran theology, Christian discipleship, and serving opportunities.

Grades 6-8 have one year focusing on each: "Who is Jesus," "Practicing Faith," and "I am a Lutheran."

Grade 9 becomes a capstone year, culminating in Affirmation Sunday, when 9th graders affirm their baptismal promises surrounded by family, friends, and our faith community.

Each Affirm year includes small group lessons, service projects, fellowship bonfires, Lenten mentors, and Family Milestones.

# **Memorial Garden**

### **Memorial Garden Update**

Early in 2016, members of the Land Use Team began having conversations about how to improve and use the property surrounding St. John's. One of the items that came up was to add Columbarium and Memorial Garden on the property. Lots of discussion and planning resulted in the installation of a Columbarium/ Ossuarium unit on one of two bases in the fall of 2022. Shortly after the installation, phase 1 of the sidewalk, from the outer Sanctuary doors to the paver base of the Columbarium was completed. A tree was donated and planted early on to kick off the soft scape plan. During the snowy winter, many able volunteers kept the access to the Memorial Garden open.

Phase 2 of the project saw the sidewalk from the parking lot completed and the garden part of the project created. Since that time, an engraved rock commemorating the gift from the Klotz family has been installed, four memorial benches were added, the garden plantings and trees have been installed and new this past summer, flowering potted plants helped expand the garden area making it a true mediative space for the frequent visitors who enjoy spending time in the memorial garden. We continue to welcome any and all "above and beyond" gifts toward the Memorial Garden. The hope is that we can expand the garden area even more next spring. We thank the dedicated memorial garden team who keeps it weeded, watered and tended for everyone to enjoy.

The memorial garden team has begun the ground work (literally) to add on to the garden space in the spring. Watch for the requests to purchase more plantings for this addition.

We also have had the opportunity to meet with another local church to help them begin the process of adding a columbarium and memorial garden to their space, sharing details about where to start. This is a true testament to the work our team has done to create such a special space.

To date, 28 units have been purchased. If you would like to learn more, just make an appointment with Candy in the church office and she can help you with a purchase of a niche or answer any questions that you might have regarding the Memorial Garden and Columbarium.
