14. **Building Policy Updates.** In February, the church council, mindful of our All Are Welcome credo, voted to approve two new additions to church policy: 1) Updates to Building and Land Use and Access Policies, and 2) Policy Regarding Response to Unannounced United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") Presence On Site. Both policies were drafted under the guidance of Dan Brown, St. John's Member and Legal Counsel. The "Building and Land Use and Access Policy" was written to clarify which areas in our church building may have restricted access for authorized persons - for a variety of reasons - for the purposes of maintaining privacy and security of personal identifying information; this policy commensurately clarifies spaces that are for public use with unrestricted access. The "Policy Regarding Response to Unannounced United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement ("ICE") Presence On Site" clarifies appropriate and legal procedures and practices, in the event of an unannounced visit from law enforcement personnel or other Government Enforcement Personnel, including the role of Judicial Warrants.
