

## St. John's EBCs, Everyday Bible Conversations!

### Reading: John 9:1-41

Welcome to this week's EBC 3,2,1! Three points, two questions, and one action step!

### Three Points

- Faith makes room for mystery. The healed man's "I do not know..." is not a failure of faith but an honest acknowledgment that God's work often exceeds our understanding. Lutherans embrace this humility because faith rests on God's promise, not our explanations. (John 9:25)
- - Certainty comes from Christ's action, not our insight. The man's confidence, "one thing I do know...", is anchored in what Jesus has done for him. Lutheran theology calls this the *promissio*: the concrete promise of Christ's saving work given to us.
- Witness is simply telling what Christ has done. The healed man doesn't debate theology; he shares his lived encounter with grace. Lutheran witness is not about having all the answers but about naming Christ's work in our lives.

### Two Questions

- - Where do you feel like the healed man—able to say "I do not know," yet still holding onto one clear thing Christ has done for you?
- How does the healed man's simple testimony ("I was blind, now I see") shape your understanding of sharing faith without needing to explain everything?

### Action Step

- Identify one "I do not know..." in your faith life and one "one thing I do know..." about Christ's love, and carry both with you this week. This mirrors the healed man's posture: honest about mystery, grounded in Christ's certainty.

*Don't like these questions? Do these verses say something different to you? Great! What it is?*
